- 1. The balustrades from the original Hall
- 2. The gate to Lady Winefride's Walk
- 3. The Ha-Ha
- 4. Stone Urn from Hall
- Beehive weather vane
- 6. Priory sleeping Quarters. (Passing old farmhouses now converted)
- 7. The original Rectory dates back to 1678
- 8. Herewyte house built in 1935 by Guy Elwes
- 9. The Elwes sign
- 10. The cobbled veg path went through numbers 4/9 to Billing Hall
- 11. Unusual War Memorial—lists those who went to war as well as those who died—opposite are former estate houses
- 12. The Old Convent
- 13. The Old Post Office and memorial to Gervase
- 14. Water pump and trough
- 15. The School House
- 16. The Catholic Church
- 17. The Elwes Arms with image of Gervase (known as Stags Head in 19th C.)
- 18. The gates to Billing Hall
- 19. Entrance to "Old Dairy" with Elwes signs either side.
- 20. The other end of the cobbled path. The ice house was behind the gate. Ice was brought up from the lake that is now Little Billing.
- 21. "Steel Traps and Spring Guns" warning sign. (Look over the boundary wall, the sign is under the eaves on the corner of the building facing you)
- 22. The old grace and favour almshouses—gardener/ smithy etc.
- 23. The Chantry reworking of stables, laundry room, outhouses.
- 24. Not shown. Just inside the gate walking back to the Church is the old Policeman's cottage.
